(First party and Second party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party') as

### **WHERE AS:**

A) First Party is a Higher Educational Institution named:

**(I) K.G.D.M. Arts, Commerce and Science College, Niphad, Dist. Nashik - 422 303.**

B) First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.

C) The Parties intent to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.

D) Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interests.

E) - Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society -, the Second Party is engaged in Skill Development, birds and butterflies education R&D Services in the fields of - **Butterfly Conservation**

F) - Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society -, the Second Party is promoted by promoter Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society, engaged in the of training of Butterfly Conservation, Butterflies are also called flying flower, displaying its beauty. These insects enhance the aesthetic value of the environments by their exquisite wing colours. These are effective pollinators.

G) Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society -, the Second Party to informing about butterflies, to guide to create a butterflies garden, awareness in the village coming under nandur madhymeshwar sanctuary & eco club in the college and trained to students.

F) Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society -, the Second Party is promoted by promoter to cultivate attractive and beautiful flowering plant for attraction of birds and butterflies to the plant.



NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE MUTUAL PROMISES SET FORTH IN THIS MoU, THE PARTIES HERE TO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

## CLAUSE 1

### CO-OPERATION

1.1. Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the **Institution** and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.

1.2. First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty of First Party providing significant inputs to them in developing suitable teaching / training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry, the Second Party.

1.3. The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall co-operate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents' as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede and prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof).

## CLAUSE 2

### SCOPE OF THE MoU

2.1. The budding graduates from the institutions could play a key role in technological up-gradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry. Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.

2.2. **Curriculum Design:** Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching / training methodology and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the awareness of birds and butterflies.

2.3. **Research and Development:** Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the field of Butterfly Conservation, Bio-pesticides and aesthetic value.

2.4. **Skill Development Programs:** Second Party to train the students of First Party on the Life History of Butterflies and plants.

2.5. **Guest Lectures:** Second Party to extend the necessary support to deliver guest lecturers to the students of the First Party on the Life History of Butterflies and plants.



2.6. **Placement of Trained Students:** Second Party will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of the First Party into internships/jobs; and will facilitate placements for the students. The Second Party will itself absorb the trained students as per available opportunities of jobs.

2.7. Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programs on the terms specified herein.

2.8. There is no financial commitment on the part of the **K.G.D.M. Arts, Commerce and Science College**, the First Party to take up any programme mentioned in the MoU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.



### CLAUSE 3

#### INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

3.1. Nothing contained in this MoU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copy rights and designs) of the other Party.

### CLAUSE 4

#### VALIDITY

4.1. This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period **Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society**, the Second Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MoU. Any act on the part of **Training Partner** or **Wildlife Heritage Conservation Society**, the Second Party after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MoU.

4.2. For academic year 2019-2020-2020-2021 to 2021-2022 both Parties may terminate this MoU upon 30 calendar days notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations.

### CLAUSE 5

#### RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

5.1. It is expressly agreed that **First Party** and **Second Party** are acting under this MoU as independent contractors and the relationship established under this MoU shall not be construed as partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any way to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the

terms of this MoU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.




